### Policy

We will use a risk-based approach to our decision making and will consult with key stakeholders and the community to deliver improved environmental outcomes.

We will regularly monitor our environmental performance and report on our performance with honesty and transparency.

We will continuously improve our environmental performance through the implementation of our Environmental Management System.

We will raise awareness of our environmental strategy, obligations and commitments and promote a culture of environmental stewardship within our business and amongst our stakeholders.

We will operate in line with our Memorandum of Understanding with the Environment Protection Authority, with the aim to minimise our regulatory burden, achieve rapid uplift in our compliance levels, and reduce key environmental risks from our operations.

We will support the protection of drinking water catchments and sensitive environments and promote reuse of treated water and by-products where practical.
