### **Works begin at Zeehan to boost water quality**

TasWater is continuing to improve the water quality in remote and regional Tasmania, with works kicking off this week.

In Zeehan, we are working to improve the quality of drinking water to our customers by closing in the two reservoirs in the town.

One reservoir is already closed in, and this week, TasWater will be commencing works to add a roof on the second reservoir which is located off Anderson Street in Zeehan.

CAD Project Engineering are contracted for the works.

“While the works are taking place, we will be operating at a reduced storage volume so any measures the community can take to conserve water is appreciated,” TasWater Project Manager Gerard Tolson said.

“TasWater does have a number of contingencies in place for the reduction, but any water saving measures in addition to this from the public will be a big help.”

Commencing on 21 October, the works will take five weeks to complete.

“During this period TasWater is emphasising water conservation, and we encourage anybody in the community who notices any leaks to report them.”
