# Margaret Street Diversion Project

## March 2023 Construction Update

### About this project

The Margaret Street Diversion Project is part of our commitment to delivering new and improved sewerage infrastructure for the City of Launceston.

Since our update late last year, we've been making great progress to construct the underground diversion chamber at our Margaret Street Pump Station.

This project is one of many we're delivering as part of the Tamar Estuary River Health Action Plan (TERHAP), working to divert sewage and stormwater flows away from Kanamaluka/Tamar estuary.

The Margaret Street Diversion Project is due to be completed in mid-2023.

### Works you will notice during March include:

- ◆ Sinking the last precast concrete segments to a depth of 10.9 metres
- ◆ Mass concrete plug to the base of the cassion
- ◆ Installing precast sewer main outlets connection
- ◆ Some odour sampling around the existing pumping station
- ◆ Excavators and other construction machinery digging trenches and transporting fill offsite.
