# Margaret Street Diversion Project

## November/December 2022 Construction Update

The Margaret Street Diversion Project is part of our commitment to delivering new and improved sewerage infrastructure for the city of Launceston.

Since our September 2022 update, we've established the project's site compound and undertaken minor preparation works.

The next phase involves transporting large prefabricated concrete rings used to construct the new underground diversion chamber at our Margaret Street Sewage Pump Station.

This project is one of many we're delivering as part of the Tamar Estuary River Health Action Plan (TERHAP) that will divert sewage and stormwater flows away from kanamaluka/Tamar estuary.

### Other works during November you will notice include:

- Delivery of construction machinery
- Installation of steel piles
- Excavation and earthworks
- Extra work crews and light vehicles
- The use of construction equipment and tools generating moderate noise.
